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





 Politics is more than facts; also values, emotions, experiences.



science based policy = technocracy = eliminating politics and democracy






So, better than fact-checkers: acknowledge the intimate relations between Science & Politics.







Given, we live in a society, imbued with science and technology – i.e. a *knowledge society*, a *technological culture*:


- How science and politics are / should be related?
